Definite schedules must be sent to the FEI Secretariat by the NFs concerned at least 4 weeks before the event takes place.

TO BE PUBLISHED VERBATIM IN ALL SCHEDULES**THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT****FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

2. DRESSAGE ARENA

Length: 100 m

Width: 40 m

For each team an area called “Village Meneurs” will be reserved on the showground, big enough for house trucks, motor homes, caravans, tents and carriages for competitors, Chefs d’Equipe, Team Veterinarian and accredited grooms and trainers.

The number of persons and vehicles / tents – including the size – is to be advised to the OC with Nominated Entries.

This area will be provided by the OC from Tuesday 4th August to Sunday 9th August evening.

Rooms adapted for disabled people must be available.

Details: A list of suitable hotels/guest houses can be provided by OC on demand so that NFs can arrange.

Competitors and Chefs d’Equipe

Requests for accommodation must be sent with entries.

Cost of accommodation will be at the cost of NFs.

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC.

Private electricity generators are allowed on the competition site. Sufficient water in designed areas will be provided for washing horses and carriages.

All dogs must be kept on the lead.

It will also be possible to stay with the locals (in the 23 villages around Conty). Requests for this kind of accommodation must be sent to the OC with the Nominated Entries.

Other accommodation will be at competitors’ expenses.

Meals: at competitors, Chefs d’Equipe and Team Vets expenses.

a) Horses

Temporary individual stabling available at the venue. The price for the stabling is 75 €/ is not included in the entry fee.

Hard horse food, straw, hay and shavings can be purchased at the competition venue.

Shavings, hay and straw can be purchased on site. Competitors should contact the Show Secretary to have the different prices. All the prices will be announced in the show office. All other types of feed have to be supplied by competitors.

This agency will inform about all necessary conditions of importation. The OC will not cover the costs of any customs clearance in accordance with GR Art. 131.

All customs documents are to be submitted at the latest by the first day of competition to the entry office.

Every competitor is obliged to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) In case of arrival from an EU-member country, a certificate for registered horses acc. To sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 of the actual valid form will be necessary.
- b) In case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to that on competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates on which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad. The competitor is responsible for the costs of issuing the health certificates.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in France.
